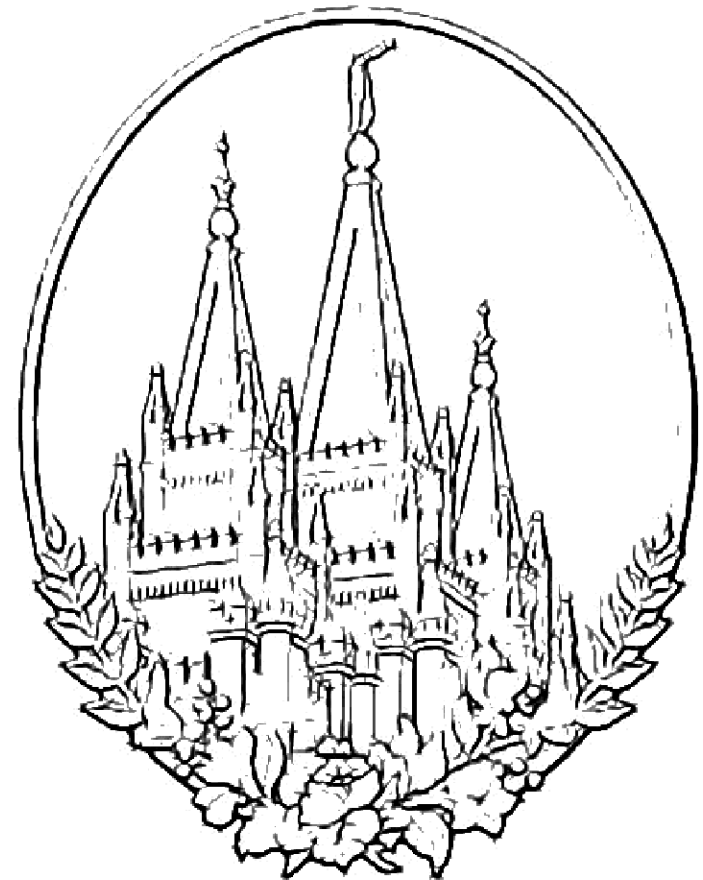


NAME THE TEMPLE

1. The first temple built off the United States mainland, it was dedicated in 1919 by Heber J. Grant.
2. After being closed two years for redecorating, this temple in the British Isles was rededicated in October 1992.
3. Mobs, fire, and a tornado destroyed this temple.
4. This was the first temple built in Europe.
5. This temple in the South Pacific was dedicated by President David O. McKay in 1958.
6. This was the first temple built in South America.
7. This temple was in the German Democratic Republic when it was dedicated in 1985.
8. Heavenly Father and Jesus Christ appeared to Joseph Smith and Oliver Cowdery here.
9. This temple near the capital of the United States is similar in design to the Salt Lake Temple.
10. President Benson presided over the groundbreaking of this newest California temple in February 1988.
11. It took forty years to complete this temple.
12. Temple work for the United States presidents and the signers of the Declaration of Independence was done in this Utah temple.
13. This temple is similar in design to the Ogden Temple.
14. This temple in Texas was dedicated in the autumn of 1984.



A temple differs from other houses of worship. Unlike chapels, the temple is closed on the Sabbath so that people can attend church and be with their families on that hallowed day. Temples are open for sacred work on other days of the week. A temple is literally the house of the Lord, reserved for ordinances of eternal significance. Those ordinances include baptisms, marriages, endowments, and sealings.
